 3. To raise the sum of about £100,000 for new taxation in Native areas would have demanded some three or four officials being employed for collection of Revenue at salaries of from £200 & £700 each: I consider this should still be carried out.


4. I do not agree with Sir Charles Borring's contention that the native taxes shall not now be raised as was outlined before I left: this should still be done if Acting Governor.

5. I strongly recommend that he fails to put up the Budget with an additional Estimate of £100,000 Revenue from Native (Income and Land taxes) and £100,000 from Native (Hut & Poll Tax), as originally proposed.
