Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your despatch No. 14736/20 of 23rd inst, transmitting copy of correspondence with Mr. A.M. Jeevanjee on the subject of a forthcoming sale of business plots in Nairobi.

2. I have discussed the matter, in principle, with Mr. Jeevanjee, and other leading Indians, in London and in East Africa.

3. It is entirely a question of principle, viz., are we or are we not to accept Professor Simpson's recommendations for Segregation of Races in townships?

4. I gave the views of the Governor-in-Council by cable from Nairobi some months ago and I await the Secretary of State's decision - either to allow us to carry out our own policy, or to dictate a different one to us.
