Sir

I beg to state that owing to the sudden very serious illness of my mother, I was compelled to cancel my passage to British East Africa on the Gart Castle.

I have attached to this letter a medical certificate in support of this statement.

As my mother is still in a critical state and is not likely to recover her normal health in several weeks, I would like to delay my departure.

I therefore beg to request that I may be allotted another passage to Aden about February 1920.
