

Dear Harding,

Will you pass this to the right department? In the Colonial Office letter of the 15th April 18339/1920) the Home Office is asked to recommend His Majesty to grant the title "Royal" to the East African Automobile Association. In a letter enclosed, it is stated by the Governor of East Africa that the privilege has been granted to the South African Automobile Association.

The Home Office has no record of this grant, and I presume the Colonial Office must have recommended the case to His Majesty.

Is the East African case sent to the Home Office? I can find no ruling as to the cases in which the Home Office and the Colonial Office respectively should act, but I cannot discover that we have ever dealt with cases of colonial clubs or societies or institutions, and we have assumed that the Colonial Office deal with all such cases, see e.g. the Colonial Office letter of the 15th August 1917 7/1917 - which implies that the Colonial Office is responsible for making recommendations to His Majesty in Colonial cases.
