With reference to your letter of May 8th regarding the Uganda Railway Advertising Office, I do not consider that any occasion exists for keeping up this office: it is quite unnecessary to advertise the Uganda Railway. The advantages offered by the East Africa Postmaster to settlers and settlers can be better explained by the various Settlement Office than by the Uganda Railway Advertising office: and the publication of pamphlets could also be undertaken by the Crown Agents.

I recently called inquiries to be made at the various Settlement Office and found that they were well acquainted with conditions in East Africa. The Government in East Africa should keep in touch with them and supply them with all information from time to time that would be of use to intending settlers.

I recommend accordingly that the Longworth services be dispensed with as soon as possible under his agreement.
