Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter No 25086/1920 of the 25th inst regarding the payment of salaries to officials of the East Africa Protectorate while on leave. I discussed the Acting Governor's despatch enclosed therewith with Mr Bottomey this morning, and regret that the Secretary of State should again have been troubled to make these decisions which should, I consider, have been made locally.

2. I propose that the requests of all the applicants in question should be granted. The only case in which there would seem to be any doubt is that of Mr S. N. Faulkner, but even in this case I consider that the arrangements made to draw salary locally for the development of his farm is a reasonable commitment and that he should be allowed to draw his salary while on leave at the rate of £15 to the pound paid in the Protectorate.
