Sir,
I beg to thank you for your letter of the 21st inst
No 73076/19, stating that on arrival in East
Africa I would probably be stationed at
Nairobi.

I am sorry to have to trouble you again
but in view of the general revision of scales
of pay in the Home Service I should be glad
to have it confirmed that the salary specified
in your letter of the 6th inst is to be war and
that improved scales of pay for East Africa
are under consideration, if not actually laid
upon. If some idea of the revised (or proposed)
scales of pay could be communicated to me
I should deem it a great favour. Any such
information I would of course be treated as

strictly confidential

I should also be obliged for particulars as to the constitution of the Post Office Staff at Manchester, as to the rank and number of each class of Officers above that of Assistant. Without such information I would not be in a position to form any estimate of my prospects of advancement.

I regret the delay which has taken place both in my own case and in length of time which elapsed between the date of my application and of my selection for appointment. I was entirely unprepared for the offer. The fact that had to make some arrangements within my present Department to avoid a loss from my Insurance Companies to the effect of my) on my previous Life Insurance policies rendered the delay inevitable.

On receipt of the information now afforded I shall be in a position to give a definite reply which will be ready.
