All these appointments are now on the permanent responsible establishment. The holder of such appointments will be granted permanent status with effect from the date of first appointment. In the case of Sanitary Inspectors or Nurses, after completion of term of service on agreement, subject to the necessity for service in any language that the holder may be required to perform as a condition of his appointment in the Service.

Qualifications

It has been decided that no candidate who does not at least possess the qualifications of the Royal Sanitary Institute is to be appointed as a

Sanitary Inspector or Nurse. If such a candidate is selected, he may be appointed as a Sanitary Inspector or Nurse.
