Sir,

With reference to Lord Milner's despatch No. 1000 of July 17th 1920 covering a letter of appointment of a female postal clerk, I have the honour to ask if you will consider a minor alteration in paragraph 2 in the wording of the terms of service by the addition, after the words "or other similar outgoings" of the following words "in the event of quarters not being available, an allowance in lieu thereof will be given."

2. A member of the Postal Staff of this Colony who was appointed under similar conditions to those expressed in Lord Milner's letter above mentioned relied on the wording of this paragraph in support of her objection to proceed on transfer to Kampala at which place although Government quarters could not at the time be provided, there was a Boarding House at which accommodation could have been obtained.
