Sir,

I have the honour to forward herewith
a form of particulars required for the
computation of a pension to Mr. E. S. Dave, a
2nd Grade Clerk in the Postal Department, who
has been pronounced unfit for further service
in this Colony by a Medical Board held on him
in India on the 8th December, 1920. A copy
of the proceedings of the Medical Board is
enclosed for your information.

2. Mr. Dave's services date from the
20th December, 1899, and he is, therefore,
eligible for a pension in respect of 20
completed years of service. The pension is
computed at Florins 949/22 per annum, with
effect from the 27th July, 1920, inclusive.

3. Although the report of the Medical
Board which invalidated this official is dated
the 8th December, 1920, I would recommend

that the pension be antedated to the 27th July, 1920, so as to cover the period of leave without pay in accordance with the precedent approved by Lord Milner in his despatch No. 429 of the 20th May, 1919.

4. Pending the receipt of your sanction to the pension recommended, I have authorized the grant of an additional allowance to Mr. Dave at the rate of Rs. 720/- per annum from the date quoted.

HEAD 1.—For Particulars.—In the case of an Officer serving on the West Coast of Africa, a statement is to be made whether he is married. (Form Collet. "Colonial Regulations," 1903.)

HEAD 3.—Statement of Allowances.—For which the Applicant is recommended, i.e., Superannuation Compensation, Compensation Allowance or Retiring Allowance, and no amount. In the case of Persons claiming an addition to their Payances in respect of professional or other special qualifications, should be stated, and a reference should be given to the authority under which the claim is made.

HEAD 5.—If the service has been interrupted.—In case of an Officer, the word "Interruption" should be used before the number of years and months, and the causes, dates and circumstances of break or break should be stated under heading 6.

HEAD 6.—Officer's Payances.—Has been in receipt of the same salary or on the wage from which he has been released, or before or since date of his retirement, the additional rate of 10/- per Month due to him during the whole of the service, provided by the word "Additional". In other cases, or where wages are claimed, the word "Wages" for the 30 months next preceding the date of retirement should be inserted, preceded by the word "Average" if out of the whole period of service, or else "Actual" if the average of the amounts paid him while still in service is wanted.

HEAD 7.—Voyage Allowance.—The sailing expenses of the voyage around Africa, for 100/- months, provided for the retirement of such Officer and his dependant salary entitlement, which is claimed in accordance with the Schedule of the Payances or Retiring Allowance.

HEAD 8.—Retirement Allowance.—An additional amount, usually 10/- per month, to be deducted from the payances, partly or wholly, according to the total average of the net receipts of the 90 months prior to the retirement of such Officer. Expenses for which he was remunerated by him, or for services rendered to him, or for disbursements made in respect of Officer's Expenses provided for the Payances or Retiring Allowance, are deducted from the average of the amounts of Payances or Retiring Allowance which a Fixed Salary is intended. Payment of these charges will be accounted for the Head of Department, and should be accompanied by three extracts from the books of officers showing the amount received by them for fees, and amount expended on account of Officer's Expenses. At the end of the three years immediately preceding the retirement, it will be the duty of the Colonial Government concerned to make known to the Secretary of State the amounts of such disbursements before transmitting them to the Colonial Office. In the case of Officers receiving 30/- Months and York, the Fees will not in ordinary estimation be allowed to exceed £10/- Persons participating in the expense of more than one quarter the Payances and Fees will not in any case be allowed to exceed the Payances Expenses during the year, unless the whole sum of the Officer's money on them has been given to the Public, he

HEAD 9.—In case of retirement, if the Applicant is below the ordinary age for retirement, a Medical Certificate is to be furnished showing that he is incapable by infirmity of mind or body for discharging the duties of his office, and that such infirmity is likely to be permanent.

In case of ten years' service or more, this certificate should be issued by two Officers of equal rank, and, if possible, by a Medical Officer of the Government.

HEAD 10.—In case of retirement, if the Applicant has not served 10 years, he must furnish a certificate showing that he is incapable of discharging the duties of his office, and that such infirmity is likely to be permanent.
