130 March 4th Following telegram is sent at the request of East African Indian National Congress to be transmitted to Secretary of State for India and Prime Minister regarding that in view of assurance given by Under Secretary of State for the Colonies in the House of Commons that question of segregation of races not receiving earnest attention of Imperial Government, when the routine no motion will be taken in connection with segregation, since this mass meeting of Indians protesting against the policy of their own government and that of the Imperial Government of local government in embodying the proposed segregation in the Public Health Bill, the Indian representative will be asked in the present form of the Bill to the local government to stop segregation of races principle and Public Health Bill be read third reading and is being forwarded for approval prior to assent ^{clause} fifteen gives power to make reservations for different races if required.
