THE PREVENTION OF CRUELTY TO ANIMALS  
(AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE, 1921.

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Ordinance was passed on the representations of the East African Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals. The draft Bill containing Section 4 of the present Ordinance was approved by the Secretary of State in his Despatch No. 1521 of 28th October last.

Two further Sections have been added, one increasing the penalties for an offence under the original Ordinance, the other extending the power given to make rules for the better carrying out of the Ordinance.

THE PREVENTION OF CRUELTY TO ANIMALS  
 (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE, 1921.

Section	Remarks.
1.	Short title.
2.	Increases the penalty for Section 8(e) of the Principal Ordinance and six months imprisonment instead of three months imprisonment.
3.	This Section extends the Governor's power of making Rules under the Principal Ordinance.  This was introduced at the request of the local Society to allow Rules to be issued similar to the Nairneshi Township Rules prohibiting the use of these ropes in excess.
4.	This Section allows a properly appointed Inspector of the East African Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals to take action in the cases in which a Police Officer is so empowered under Section 8(2) of the Principal Ordinance.
