3. These plans would have been submitted earlier but I had intended discussing the question at the Round Table Conference referred to in my Cypher telegram 6th of January. The Executive Committee of the Indian Congress have informed me that in view of the action of the Legislative Council in supporting the principle of segregation in both the Public Health Bill and in the planning of the commercial area of Nairobi Town they are not prepared to appoint delegates to attend this Conference without consulting a full meeting of the Congress which is called for the 1st February this month.

4. I trust you will be in touch with your Agent and I would like to add that I have informed the Government of my decision on this matter, since I am anxious to be in a position to make a public announcement in due course as early a date as possible.

AREA NO. 1.

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The Coastal Zone (other than as provided for in Area No. 2) to an approximate depth of 10 miles inland from the Indian Ocean and extending from the Sabaki (Galana) River on the South to Anglo-Italian boundary on the North.

Excepting and excluding Native Reserves and rights, Government Township and other Reserves.

AREA NO. 2.

Commencing at the Uganda Railways Bridge across the  
Teso River,

thence bounded by that River down to the point of its junction  
with the Ati (Galana) or Sasezi River.

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The boundary line then continues due North to the  
place where it meets the Tuguru River, thence continuing  
the boundary line to Tukuyu on the River Tana, and then  
the boundary line is a straight line to the River Tana.  
The boundary line then turns Westward in  
direction to the intersection with the Uganda Railways  
spanned by the Kivuli and Teso Rd., the boundary line  
on the point of commencement.

Excepting the exclusively Native Reserve areas and the  
Government Townsite, all other Reserve areas are  
Government Townsites and Native Reserves.

Commencing at the intersection of the Eastern boundary of Sultan Hamud township Reserve with the Uganda Railway,

thence bounded by part of the Eastern boundary of that Township Reserve northerly to its intersection with the Southern boundary of farm L.O. No. 1758,

thence by part of the Southern and Eastern boundaries of that farm Easterly and Northerly to the intersection of its Eastern boundary with the Mwatinene River which river forms part of the Southern boundary of the Machakos Native Reserve,

thence by the Southern boundary of that Reserve in a generally Easterly direction to the junction of the Chunyu and Kiangini Rivers,

thence by a line due East to the Athi (Galana or Sabaki) River,

thence by that River down-stream to its junction with the Teavo River,

thence by the Teavo River up-stream to its junction with the Kikalelwa River,

thence by the South-Eastern boundary of the Masai Reserve North-Easterly to the most Southerly peak of the Chyulu Range,

thence by the generally Southern, South-Eastern, North-Easterly and North-Western boundaries of the Kiramboeria (Chyulu Block) Native Reserve, to the North-Eastern boundary of the Masai Reserve,

thence by the North-Eastern boundary of that Reserve Northeasterly to the Trigonometrical Beacon on Mt. (Kemali) Hill,

thence by a line North-Easterly to the Uganda Railway,

thence by the Uganda Railway up-line to the point of commencement.
