I am directed by ~~Vicecount Milner~~ to inform you that, subject to your being passed as physically fit for service, ^{if it is} proposed to select you for appointment as a Postal Clerk and Telegraphist in East Africa with salary at the rate of £300 per annum, rising by annual increments of £15 to £330 per annum. ~~A war bonus is also payable at present in accordance with the scales shown in the enclosed memorandum.~~ *An outfit allowance of £30 is payable on first appointment.*

2. Furnished quarters when available will be provided by the Government for single men free of rent, but not of rates or other similar outgoings. When such quarters are not available ~~temporary accommodation~~ but *temporary accommodation* or other temporary shelter is provided, or in certain cases a allowance in lieu of quarters is granted at the direction of the Government. Free second class passages will be provided to and from East Africa, and a free pass over the Uganda Railway between Mombasa and the place at which you are stationed.

6. It is necessary that you should understand that you are liable to serve either in the ~~East Africa~~ ^{Kenya} Protectorate or Uganda, and that you may be transferred from either of these ~~Protectorates~~ ^{territories} to the other according to the requirements of the Government.

7. It will be within the power of the Governor ~~of the Protectorate~~ to determine your appointment at any time within the period of the engagement, should he think fit, granting you a free passage to this country and the leave for which you are qualified by your service in East Africa. In that event you will revert to the Home Service provided that you are physically fit, and that your official conduct has been satisfactory, at the expiration of your leave or as soon thereafter as there is a vacancy.

8. If you are prepared to accept this offer of appointment, you should present yourself at once to one of the Medical Advisers to this Department, whose names are given on the enclosed letter, for the purpose of being medically examined. The letter is to be left with him, and he will send his report direct to this Department. The fee ~~of examination~~ for the examination will be paid by the Government and, if it is necessary for you to make a journey by railway to visit the Medical Adviser, you may submit a claim ^{to our Dept} for the refund of the return railway fare (3rd class).

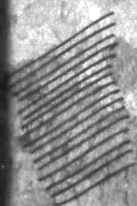
