1/37 March 19th Your telegram 15th March your telegram 16th March Re-organisation of Post Office provided five new appointments of Postmasters £400 to £500 and further vacancy resulting from Pearson's promotion making total six. Four filled by Donovan Bayler Moir Freeman. One earmarked for obtaining Telegraph Traffic expert from England. Another earmarked for home trained man from another Colony preferably formerly in the service of Kenya such as Sutcliffe of Gold Coast but if not available for appointment should be left vacant or abolished. Direct appointment from British Post Office to Postmaster grade should be limited traffic expert presumably represented by Macdonald. Pocock suitable for relieving Postmaster item 10 page 217 1922 Estimates for which should be seconded for 3 years.
