This organisation provides 5 new appts of Postmasters £100-£200 and further Vacancy gives Pearson making six. Four filled by Denovan, Hayter, Mair, Freeman. One ear-marked for Telegraph Traffic expert. Another for home trained man from another Colony preferably formerly in Kenya &g. SUTCLIFFE. If not available appt should not be filled. Direct appt from G.P.O. To Postmaster should be limited to traffic expert presumably Mac Donald. P.G.C.C. suitable for relieving postmaster provided far in ests.

It was a good thing that we telegraphed.

It appears from this that only one Postmaster is required from this date at any rate for the time being, and I informed Mr. Sanbrook accordingly immediately that this telegram is received. We should now let the G.P.O. know officially with reference to letter on 640 that it has been ascertained that there is ~~an~~ Vacancy for a Postmaster, and that the offer, therefore, to Mr. Jessop must be withdrawn.

2. It further appears that the post of relieving Traffic Expert refecting to us in 1920 is the same as that of Postmaster for which we have selected Macdonald, and I have accordingly written to Mr. Sanbrook as in copy attached, asking him to cancel para. 3 of our letter of the 15th of March on 1920. The mistake about this was not seen our fault.

I understand that Mr. Sutcliffe is now drawing £600 p.a. on the scale £400-£920, so that he is not in

the

the least likely to desire a re-transfer to Kenya to a £400-£500 job. The Promotions Dept. will perhaps say whether they have a note of any home trained man formerly in the service of Kenya who could be considered for a transfer. If they have not a note of any such man, we may letter tell the Governor that there is not one available.

22. As to 1 or 2 it is better wait until the Promotions Dept. arrive, when we shall be able to tell exactly what salary we are in a position to offer.

formerly in the service of Kenya such as Sutcliffe of
Gold Coast but if not available for appointment
should be left vacant or abolished. Direct appointment
from British Post Office to Postmaster grade should
be limited traffic expert presumably represented by
Macdonald. Pocock suitable for relieving Postmaster
