PARAPHRASE TELEGRAM

From the Secretary of State for the Colonies to the
Governor of Kenya.

(Sent 5 p.m. 31st March, 1921.)

31st March. With reference to your telegram of 23rd
March I am practically committed with the Secretary of State
for India to the withdrawal of Mombasa notice and am anxious
it is as far as possible not to go back on my undertaking. Public
Health Ordinance raises questions of such vital importance that
it is impossible to take any action with regard to it in absence
of Secretary of State but matter will be taken up immediately
on my return and every effort made to inform you as soon as
possible of decision. It would not appear in the meantime
that position can be seriously prejudiced by withdrawal of the
notice as presumably no building operations can actually start
for some little time before which it may be hoped that Ordinance
will be in force. Telegraph reply.
