If the person retiring has had a constant Salary or Wages for the 36 months next preceding the date of his retirement, he should be paid by the word "average," but if the whole period of service has not been constant, the whole period of service should be inserted.

When ever the value of a House or House Allowance so ascertained, exceeds one-sixth part which ought for Taxes purposes, it is to be reduced to one-sixth part, and no more, for the whole.

From which an officer is allowed to retain for his personal expenses purposes, with regular salary, at the annual average of the net receipts of the 36 months preceding the Officer's retirement. These net receipts are to be ascertained by deducting the gross amount of Fees such Office Expenses, &c., as are to be or may have been had from his own resources, for performing the services for which he was remunerated by Fees, dividends, &c., when from the fees shall be made up respect of Office Expenses provided by the Rules for each year of his service to which a fee was always annexed. If the Officer has been absent from the Colony for more than six months, and has accompanied by him a servant, who has been engaged during the same period, the sum for Fees, &c., shall be increased by one-half. The sum so calculated for each year of the three years immediately preceding the date of retirement, is to be forwarded to the Colonial Government to satisfy themselves that it is the last amount of money due to the Colonial Office. In the event of the Officer having a balance due to him, the Fees will not, in ordinary circumstances be accounted for. The sum payable to the account of more than one quarter of his Salaries, and Fees, & wages, &c., will be counted for Pension purposes during a period in which the whole of the Officer receiving them was not given to the Public Service.

The authorizing officer may, if he so desires, have his signature affixed to the document, and the signature of the professional Civil Officer has been allowed to have "private" pronoun, the facts are to be fully stated.

Because of the application of the above deduction from his income under clause 102 of the Income Tax Act, he will be taxed as stated.

**If this Paper of Particulars and the Evidence connected with it, be not sent in original, the Commissioner may object.**

**HEAD 1 OR PAPER.—** In the case of an Officer serving on the West Coast of Africa, a statement is to be added whether he is a native of that Coast. (Colonial Regulations, § 43.)

**HEAD 3.—** State the description of Allowance for which the Applicant is recommended, viz. Superannuation Compensation, Compassionate Allowance, or Gratuity, and its amount. In the case of Professionals claiming an addition to their Pensions in respect of Professional or other special qualifications, such should be stated, and a reference should be given to the authority under which the claim is made.

**HEAD 5.—** If the service has been interrupted by one or more breaks, the word "broken" should be used before or after the number of years and months, and the causes, dates, and circumstances of each break or breaks should be stated under heading 9.

**HEAD 6.—** If the Person retiring has been in receipt of the same Salary, or in the class from which he retires, for the 36 months immediately before the date of his retirement, the actual annual amount of Salary or Wages at that date should be inserted, preceded by the word "actual." In other cases the average annual amount of Salary or Wages for the 36 months next preceding the date of retirement should be inserted, preceded by the word "average," but if the whole period of service is less than three years, then the average for the whole period of service should be inserted.

**HEAD 7.—** A statement should be inserted of the average Annual Value, for the 36 months immediately preceding retirement, of each Enement (exclusive of salary or wages) which is claimed to be included in the calculation of the Pension or Gratuity.

Wherever the value of a House or Hidde Allowance, so ascertained, exceeds one-sixth of salary and other emoluments which count for Pension purposes, it is to be reduced to one-sixth that amount, so that it shall not exceed one-seventh of the whole.

Fees which an officer is allowed to retain for his own use will not be taken into account for Pension purposes, with regular salary, at the annual average of the net receipts of the 36 months next preceding the Officer's retirement. These net receipts are to be ascertained by deducting the gross amount of Fees such Office Expenses, &c., as an officer may have had to pay from his own resources, in performing the services for which he was remunerated by Fees. Deductions, however from the Fees should be made in respect of Office Expenses provided by Public Funds, for the discharge of those duties to which a Fixed Salary is annexed.

Statements forwarded to the Colonial Department should be accompanied by Declarations from the retiring Officers, showing the amount received by them for Fees, and amount retained as above for Office Expenses, &c., in each of the three years immediately preceding the retirement. It will be the duty of the Commissioner to ascertain and verify the accuracy of such statements before forwarding them to the Colonial Office. In the case of Officers receiving Fixed Salaries and Fees, the Fees will not in ordinary circumstances be taken into account for Pension purposes to the extent of more than one-quarter of the salaries, and Fees will not in any case be allowed to count for Pension purposes during any period in which the officer in question was receiving them, unless the reason for doing so is given.

**HEAD 8.—** If the Applicant is below the ordinary age for retirement, a Medical Certificate is to be forwarded showing him to be disabled by infirmity of mind or body for discharge of his duties of his station, and that such infirmity is likely to continue.

In case of ten years' service or more, this Certificate should be signed by two Officers, whom at least one should, if possible, be a Salaried Officer of the Government.

**HEAD 9.—** As to "broken" service see Head 5.

If the Applicant has had any "acting" service, the details must be fully given, and a statement whether or not, during the "acting" service, he was connected with the permanent Service of the Colony.

**HEAD 11.—** If, in special circumstances, a professional Civil Officer has been allowed to have "private pay" without forfeiting his claim to Pension, the facts are to be fully stated.

**HEAD 14.—** If the Applicant is liable to pay deduction from his service under Clause 102 of the Regulations, the facts should be fully stated.

**HEAD 19.—** The length of service and other particulars of the computation are to be given. Whether fixed salary &c., is taken, the mode of calculating it, whether 12 months therefrom is to be excluded.
