Explains different rates for locally manufactured and imported soaps. As however Z'bar soap is 4d per lb cheaper than imported soap in Nairobi cannot agree tariff affects British exporters adversely as represented by Messrs Gossage. Promises separate despatch as to import duties on Z'bar soaps.

The ruling given by Mr. Nothing does not explain itself in any way & will probably be dealt with more fully in the further despatch promised.

Remember the figures quoted do not in themselves prove much if British soap is much better than Z'bar soap. The removal of preferential tariff enabled British manufacturers to ask a penny or related price they might be able to compete successfully.

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your despatch No. 606 of April 22nd, 1921, with which was transmitted a copy of a letter from Messrs. William Gossage & Sons, Limited, on the subject of preferential Railway rates for soap of local manufacture.

2. There is no manufacture of soap in this Colony but since 1919 under a ruling given by Sir Edward Northey, soap manufactured in Zanzibar has been regarded as produce of this Colony, and is therefore classified in the Uganda Railway Tariff Book as "Country Produce" and carried at lower rates than imported goods. The surcharge on all kinds of soap is however the same viz: 7s:2/- per 100 lbs.

3. The effect of the discrimination may be seen from the following schedule:-

respectively. The lowest retail price however of imported soap in Nairobi is four pence half penny per lb; in excess of that of Zanzibar soap.


4. I am therefore unable to agree that the difference in the Railway Tariff affects British Exporters of soap so adversely in the <sup>African</sup> market as Messrs. William Gossage and Company Limited have represented.
