In the meantime the Gov. ~~has~~  
reported that the Order is not aimed  
against the Indian community, but  
was framed primarily to enable  
the Gov. to deal with persons who  
were removed from Canada under  
Sec. 5 of "The Immigration, Restriction  
& Removal of Undesirable Persons  
Act, 1913" that Part that section  
reads as follows "Any person  
within the Prot. & not being a native  
of the Prot. who for any official  
reason, is deemed by the Gov. to be  
an undesirable may be ordered by  
the Gov. to remove himself from the  
Prot. within a date to be fixed in  
the Order."
