Seteber 3rd. Indian policy your oypher telegram of 1st October received and underswood. Your confidential despatch of 26th August and September 8th find it most inadvisable until after I have interview with leading Europeans to publish that one Indian will be appointed to the Executive Council and four to Legislative Council. Whole European community are pledged to uphold Milner policy and in accordance with instructions in your telegram of 20th August and your despatch No.1355 of 5th September have been informed that you would not make any decision until I have discussed matter with them. To make nominations above mentioned would be a new decision and would be highly resented if done before I have discussed matter and put forward other proposals. I am meeting Europeans of Friday and discussing matters with Indians also this week. Meanwhile I will only make following statement on October 10th at opening of Legisletive Council We hasty decision will be taken and nothing will be done until further discussion locally . I will keep you informed of the result of conferences.
