I have the honour to refer to my telegram No. 24 of 15th January in which Your Lordship was asked to sanction the expenditure of £850, for which no provision was made in the Estimates of 1919/20 to initiate a quarantine scheme in this protectorate; this expenditure was approved in your Lordship's telegram dated 21st January.

2. I enclose for your Lordship's information a copy of a memorandum submitted to the Director of Agriculture by the Acting Chief Veterinary Officer detailing, and in support of, his scheme.

3. The proposals put forward by the Acting Chief Veterinary Officer seem to me to be sound. They are calculated greatly to help in preventing the introduction and spread of stock diseases, to assist settlers in securing breeding and transport cattle; moreover the quarantine stations will make and more facilitate the movement of cattle thus rendering possible the introduction of a cattle tax on the pastoral

pastoral tribes by opening stock routes from districts at present closed on account of disease. They do not demand the services of a number of qualified veterinary Officers and the professional supervision required can be given by the present Veterinary Staff, an important consideration in view of the acute shortage of qualified officers.

4. In order to secure proper supervision and control, an appointment of a Chief Quarantine Officer will however be necessary, and it is proposed to transfer Lieutenant-Colonel Neave from the post of Statistician to which he was recently gazetted to the new appointment, for which he is exceptionally fitted by training and experience. A decision on the nature of the duties of this officer may be postponed for further consideration until the recommendations of the Acting Chief Veterinary Officer on this subject will not necessarily be adopted.

5. The salary of £500 at present drawn by this officer has been shown in the Estimates but the consideration of an appropriate scale of remuneration for this post may be deferred until later.

6. It is not proposed to create expenses by providing at the present time for the posts of Stock Inspectors other than temporary.

If, therefore, any unforeseen change in the situation were to arise in the future, or should the necessity cease to exist, no irrevocable commitment

of an

of an excessive nature will have been incurred by this Government.

7. Your Lordship will observe from the figures in Mr. Brassey-Edwards' memorandum, that the scheme will be more than self-supporting if the anticipated revenue is realised. It has seemed desirable, therefore, to make a start as soon as possible, as the engagement of Stock Inspectors and acquisition of equipment and supplies will take time.

8. In accordance with Your Lordship's telegraphic sanction the sum of £860 will be spent in starting three quarantine stations without delay, and provision will be made in the Estimate 1930/31 for the sum required to meet the balance of the initial cost and the recurrent expenses of the scheme.

I trust that the proposals will meet with Your Lordship's approval.



5. The closing off sources of supply of Livestock Supplementary reserves owing to quarantine restrictions and the lack of facilities for the importation of stock from areas out of the Protectorate.

REQUIREMENT

The information available at present can absorb in the very near future when the allotted "X-Soldier" farms are occupied not less than 500,000 head of cattle alone for herds, it being at the present moment about 40,000 head cattle to enter annually into the settlements via the few existing Veterinary quarantine stations, and though the numbers passing through these Bomas are showing a gradual increase the present rate of supply is totally inadequate to the requirements of the Protectorate, and facilities for the introduction of a greatly increased number are urgently needed.

PROPOSED MEASURES

1. Possibility of establishing a Veterinary station in the Protectorate to facilitate the improved, i.e. more rapid movement of cattle. This would consist of the establishment of Veterinary quarantine stations at various strategical points throughout the Protectorate to enable Livestock to be safely transited and settled areas from the Native Reserves, quarantine areas, i.e. the conquered territories of Ruanda, Uganda and Abyssinia.

The existence of these Veterinary quarantine stations would permit of the movement of stock (which would otherwise be extremely dangerous to the welfare of the stock industry) from sources hitherto practically untapped and so largely increase the flow of healthy livestock into the Protectorate, and still acting as legalised exists which would render the importation of wild, disease stock through them, and at the same time, lessening the illicit introduction of live stock, the profitable nature of which traffic at present offers so great a temptation to dealers, as affording thereby the means of spreading stock diseases into the settled areas.

The success which has hitherto attended the establishment of the quarantine stations now in existence affords a clear indication of what might be expected if the system were extended throughout the Protectorate.

The proposed scheme is to establish Veterinary quarantine stations to act as exits to the following known sources of supply.

CONQUERED TERRITORY.

The Chief Veterinary Officer, Conquered Territory reports that the native cattle there are estimated at approximately 4,000,000 head. The only outlet of stock from the Conquered Territory into this Protectorate is probably retrospective (illegal smuggling), as the road from Mysore via Kusumati would be closed during the rains, the average about 7 months, which is sufficient to exhaust inexhaustibly. This is, moreover, a healthy and risky method of operation, which entails a well-known loss of revenue. The CVO has said that it is therefore proposed to build a station at Kusumati to inspect and stamp cattle leaving the Conquered Territory.

It is proposed to have a Veterinary Inspector at Kusumati, who will inspect and stamp cattle leaving through the road leading to the Conquered Territory.

One Veterinary Quarantine Station is each of these areas.

In addition to these proposed new stations it is probable that the present small Veterinary stations at Thika and Machakos would require to be enlarged for the purpose of passing cattle out of quarantined areas.

The total new stations proposed is thus either ten or eleven according to whether two or three would be necessary on the border of the Conquered Territory.

It would be essential to have two Stock In postors at each, both on account of the relative situation of the posts and in order to deal with a reasonably large number of stock, five days for Inspector per month being spent as many as he can manage satisfactorily. It is also necessary to co-ordinate the working of all these stations well as accounts of the Quarantine Posts will be very necessary matter. The Stock In postors at the appropriate posts & class office shall be responsible for the welfare of the animals kept in their charge and of those sent to them for dips post on account of his having been Veterinary Service on long period in the [redacted].

Two Stock Inspectors to be placed at each of

the four main quarantining stations, Abigari; Akiti; Algeyo, (Reserve) Uaso Nyiro, Machakos, Naivasha, and one each at Ngong, Thika; Migabe; Trans Mara = Total 22.

Stock inspectors will be required to supervise public and private dips on the introduction of the Cattle Cleansing Ordinance.

A plan is attached of the proposed stock routes and sites of dipping tanks.

Quarantine Staff.

Additional Stock Inspectors will be required to cover the additional areas, but for the present the scheme could be staffed with a staff of twenty.

For the rapid transit of Sera, Vaccines and Virulent Blood as well as for urgently required stores and for inspection duties mechanical transport will be essential.

6 Box Ford Cars are the minimum number requisite and as they would be very heavily worked it would be necessary that they should be in perfect order, either new, or practically so.

It is suggested that they be bought direct from America, this is only being purchased and the box body fitted locally.

They would be distributed as follows:-

Nairobi	-	3 Box Cars	For stations at Nairobi, Ngong, Thika, Tharaka.
Mombasa	-	1 Box Car	For stations at Mombasa.
Malindi	-	1 Box Car	For station at Malindi.
Port	-	1 Box Car	For London, shipping and general use.

Scotch carts will be required for carrying supplies and stations for the drivers. Total cost of 12 Scotch carts, 16 Tyres and spare parts, 16 Boxes and trek gear, 90 AM & T trained oxen & Rs.1200/- for cartage to be obtained from a local firm in Mombasa or Nairobi.
