I have the honour to refer to Lord Milner's despatch No.1070 of the 30th of July, 1920, in which sanction was accorded for the payment to Mr. A.J. de Mello, 3rd Head Clerk in the Survey Department, of a pension of £22-14-8 per annum ~~or £18-11/-~~ per annum, and to state that in view of the ruling contained in your despatch No.292 of the 18th of February last Mr. de Mello's pensionable service will count from the 1st December, 1906, the date of his first appointment.

2. His pension has accordingly been re-computed and will amount to £18-4-0/- per annum.

shillings, I do not intend  
to seek approval to imply  
that, if the pensioner is  
resident in India payment  
should still be made in  
shillings converted into Indian  
rupees at the current rate of  
exchange.

2. For the particular case  
under reference, pension will,  
under the ruling communicated  
to you in my predecessor's  
conf. despatch of the 22nd of  
Jan., 1921, be payable at  
the rate of 806 shillings a year  
only while Mr. De Mello is  
absent in ~~Kenya~~ Uganda or  
elsewhere. If he is resident in  
India, pension will be payable  
at the rate of 423 Indian  
rupees a year.
