With reference to your telegram of the 31st October regarding the point of entry into the revised scales of salary of officers who married between 1st April, 1920, and the date of announcement of the new salaries, viz. 9th August, 1920, I have the honour to bring to your notice the cases of two officers who married within the period specified, but are debarred from enjoying the privilege conferred in your telegram by reason of the expression used therein, viz. "who actually drew married war bonus".

1. Mr. E. Lewis, Deputy Chief Accountant in the Post and Telegraph Department, married on 1st June, 1920, whilst on leave in England, and, having been informed that revision of salaries was under consideration, made no claim to married war bonus until his return to this country in September, 1920, when he found that war bonus had been abolished by the introduction of the new salaries.

2. Mr. J.F. Walker, Computer in the Survey Department, married on 29th July, 1920, whilst on leave in England, and drew no salary after

26th July until his return to Kenya, owing to some delay in effecting his re-engagement. By the time he returned to this country war bonus had been abolished, and he never actually drew the war bonus.

It is clear that both these cases, and possibly others, come within the spirit, if not the letter, of the concession authorized in your telegram as we quoted, and I shall be glad if your authority to include among those who benefit by the ruling contained in your telegram under reference such officers as were entitled to, for some reason failed to draw married war bonus during the period specified.
