Sir,

With reference to my despatch No. 1670 of November 30th last and telegraphic correspondence concluding with my telegram of the 14th December on the subject of the East Africa Trading Company, I have the honour to inform you that the White Fathers Mission desires to meet the whole of the acknowledged debt viz. Rs. 17,188 by the payment of German rupee notes.

2. These notes are practically worthless and the Mission is no doubt anxious to rid itself advantageously of notes the redemption of which it took no steps to claim from the local Controller at the proper time. The acceptance of these notes would eliminate the possibility of paying a further dividend to the Company's local creditors and I recommend that they be refused if Sir H.C. Eggar, M.V.O., can obtain payment in London.

3. The absence of any receipt tends to make it impossible to demand more than the sum admitted and I should be glad to know what course of action you advise. Should it be found impossible to collect any portion of this sum in London I suggest that I be authorized to instruct the Local Controller to negotiate
