We shall be glad to know whether Postal Clerks and Telegraphists are now appointed by you for joint service in Kenya and Uganda. We have in the past received letters from you appointing them to "East Africa" and in accordance with arrangements made verbally with your Department we have in such cases altered the passage agreement to provide for service in either Uganda or Kenya.

We notice from your letter No. 15216 S.A. of the 15th April that Mr. F.S. Mackrell has been appointed for service in Kenya and we are therefore mentioning that Dependency only in his passage agreement.

We shall be glad however, to know whether the practice of appointing Postal Clerks and Telegraphists for ^{joint} service in ~~either~~ Kenya ^{and} Uganda has now ceased.
