Sir,

With reference to your letter of 17th May, No. 22803/21 relative to the salaries of certain appointments in the Uganda Railway and Marine, I have the honour to state that the scales proposed for the following appointments viz:-

Firemen	(Special class)
Artizan	(2nd class)
"	(Assistants)
Apprentices to Inspectors	

are insufficient to attract candidates from the United Kingdom and conclude that it is intended to fill them locally.

2. We observe that the proposed scale for Guards (1st class) is £200-10-£250 whereas on the Tanganyika Railway it is £200-15-£250, and suggest that the increment should be the same on both Railways.

3. Stock Verifiers on the Tanganyika Railway are paid £250-15-£400 and seeing that we have experienced no trouble in securing suitable candidates at these terms we are of opinion that this rate should be adopted for the Uganda Railway, instead of £300-15-£400 as proposed.
