28th June, 1921.

Gentlemen,

Referring to the amount of £63.6s.8d. which my son Dr. Lovell owes to the Government of Kenya for Hospital charges, I see you have given him until the end of August, to pay it. As he is not in a position to do this and I fear never will be owing to his bad health, I shall hope to pay it for him. I am wondering whether you will allow me to pay it in quarterly instalments, I could manage if you would arrange this. I fear I could not pay it all at once, as my income is £280 a year of which £130 comes from the Government of Trinidad paid to me quarterly. Hoping this will meet with your appreciation.
