

There are two things which it seems to me  
to be important to keep absolutely separate.

1. Extension of engagement for an extended tour.
2. Renewal of engagement for a new tour.

As I understand it, clause 1 deals with 1, clause  
2 with 2. If so, I don't understand how the  
engagement can be "extended" under clause 2.  
Should not "2" be altered to "1(3)" or if the  
reference is to re-engagement, "extended" to  
"renewed". As the clause stands at present it  
seems to me to be open to misinterpretation.

(1) I found in my return from leave  
that somehow or other the new Ag.  
had not returned for delivery  
with the agreement for Kenya  
Police Constables & for the  
Uganda Railway, (see para 5  
of despatch Kenya 135-2 of 3-9-21)

(2) The Kenya Police are in  
within a peculiar position, as  
they come under <sup>under</sup> special const<sup>s</sup> - the  
agreement now is as follows - for  
discipline they come under  
the Police Ord<sup>r</sup> (so to speak)  
(agreement).

(3) There are some minor amendment -  
eg. Clause 16 to put on the  
same footing as for other ranks  
in agreement - so in view of the  
special const<sup>s</sup> for Constables, we  
must, I think, get more concurrence  
of the Govt. in any new form of  
agreement.

2. Inform C.A. that I hope it will be glad to take  
it up again for consideration. It is  
an agreement for these Police Constables,  
based so far as appears, mainly  
on the new Reg. Class B agreement -  
adding that we shall want to  
refer this to Govt. before it is  
finally approved - & that

Meanwhile, if they have occasion to  
engage any Constable, per G of  
the present agreement will be  
selected & an addendum 416  
made outside the agreement  
as for other agreements, namely  
the same form as the leave  
addendum now agrees on  
these agreements.
