MINUTES

First of all the procedure is all wrong. If Lt. Bowen is in S. Africa, recovery should have been made by Pretoria direct from Kenya.

Second. Although wound gratuity and wound pension were originally accepted by us as a C.C. liability (see 38499/21) we subsequently understood that Lt Bowen was a 'service volunteer' and that wound pension would therefore be a charge on Union funds (see 42256/21). But I confess I do not quite understand the clash between wound pension and disability retired pay. Presumably
