With reference to the passage grants paid to East African officials, we understand, semi-officially, from your department that when the net cost of the passage tickets is known to be less than the full grant, the net cost only of the tickets should be paid. Will you please confirm this.

For our guidance in arriving at the net cost, should we take the re-booking allowance into consideration? This is an allowance of 10% allowed by the Union-Castle Company on return passages booked within twelve months. It is quite distinct from the Civil Service rebate of 10% which is not take into consideration by us in arriving at the cost of the passage tickets.
