With reference to the passage grants paid to East African officials, we understand, semi-officially, from your Department that when the net cost of the passage tickets is known to be less than the full grant the net cost only of the tickets should be paid. Will you please confirm this.

For our guidance in arriving at the net cost, should we take the re-booking allowance into consideration? This is an allowance of 10% allowed by the Union Castle Company on return passages booked within twelve months. It is quite distinct from the Civil Service rebate of 10% which is not taken into consideration by us in arriving at the cost of the passage tickets.

Gentlemen,

With ref. to

your minute no.

of Pass. 1045/19 of

the 14th of Oct.,

regarding the allowances
made to officers of
the E. African Dependencies

who make their
own arrangements for
travelling to S.A. with
their wives & families.

I am now to inform you
that when the net cost of
the tickets (i.e. the sum
actually paid by the officer)
is less than the full grant
payable, the net cost only
should be paid to the
officer.

2. In arriving at the
net cost, any allowances made
by the shipping to which
reduces the cost of the tickets
must be taken into account,
though such allowances are
not, of course, taken into
consideration in arriving at the
amount of the full grant
payable.
