The Minister of the Serb-Croat-Slovene Kingdom presents his compliments to His Excellency Earl Curzon of Kedleston and with reference to His Majesty's Order of November 26th 1920, with regard to the disposal of property belonging to Mr. Marco YELITCH, has the honour to state that a direct application has been made by the above mentioned, to this Legation regarding his claims, with the same statements already known to His Majesty's Government of India. According to the enclosed estimate of his claims, Mr. Yelitch claims the sum of 27,400 rupees for rents due for the period during his interment and for furniture and other belongings.

With reference to the above and owing to the fact that Mr. Marco Yelitch has been recognized in the meantime by the Government of the Serb-Croat-Slovene Kingdom, as a Serb-Croat-Slovene subject, His Majesty's Government has the honour to ask his excellency to be kind enough to see that the above matter receives the full consideration of the authorities concerned, in order that the estate of the applicant can be released and handed over to him, and the question which has arisen regarding his claims for indemnification, finds a favourable solution in the near future.
