My Lord:-

The question of the payment of rates by Portuguese citizens residing at Zanzibar, which was the subject of correspondence between the Foreign Office and this Legation in 1915-16, namely Lord Grey of Fallodon's Note No. 222353/16 of the 10th November 1916, has again been brought to my notice by a recent judgment delivered at Mombasa against Portuguese subjects.

Though I have not received full particulars from my Government, as this sentence appears to infringe Treaty Rights, I would request Your Lordship to be good enough to inform me on what grounds the procedure adopted by the Zanzibar Courts is based, and, should it involve a differential treatment for Portuguese citizens, to cause that instructions be sent to the Zanzibar Government in order that no further action be taken and the execution of the judgment delivered be suspended.
