Dear Excellency,

I did not fail to communicate to you the
arrangement of His Majesty's Government
with regard to the ~~abolition~~^{reduction} of the
Army, & the officers ~~under~~^{now} in the
service of England which was contained
in the Anglo-Swiss Agreement.

1. I am now informed by His Majesty's Secretary
of State that the Colonies that the efficiency
of the forces intended to be left in ~~not~~^{not} necessary
should be greatly increased. In this, except the
newly formed part of the ~~affectionate~~^{affectionate} which is to be placed
under your government, the Army is alleged that
has been prevented from having its rear weakened, this
action has no doubt been taken for the protection of
the Gurkha tribe in the north-eastern portion of the
Northern Frontier District.

2. With regard to the point referred to the 5th
paragraph of your Memorandum, His Majesty's Secretary
of State for the Colonies informs me that he is tenth

to indicate that there was no good foundation for the
current military projections against the capabilities of
your Government which were the basis for recommendations
stated in Schedule 2 to the original draft Treaty. And
as you know well as aware, every effort to sustain the
relationship between the neighbouring administrations
have been most strenuous, nor can we believe that
any other approach would have emerged if any
of your officials had been present.

On the other hand, the Canadian Government has
not been able to make any significant contribution to
the negotiations.
