Dear Mr. Henderson,

In reply to your note of the 28th ultimo, I feel some doubt as to whether the provisions of the Act of 1902, relating to retirement after 20 years' service, ought to be extended to you.

In the first place, I do not see how any part of your service or was at the relevant period comprised in the description "Colonial or Protectorate service" or not.

Secondly, he was retired on reduction in 1902 and did not get a gratuity on discharge. This would have the effect of preventing his South African service from being even as qualifying service for the purpose of the Act of 1902, were it possible otherwise to reckon for pension. It would be inconvenient to allow it to reckon towards the 20 year period now in question.
