be desirable to have a scale of pay
in the interim way before his permanent offer is
approved. Any such permanent offer should,
I think, be on the usual scale of £400 - £200 - £250
- £25 - £100 + £60 duty, boarding expenses, but
at £420 as from the beginning of the second year
temporary service, and with only 2 years probation
instead of three.
