My Lord,

I have the honour to inform Your Lordship that owing to an unexpected extension of the War at the European Hospital Nairobi, it has been necessary during the current financial year to engage the services of three Nursing Sisters in excess of the establishment sanctioned under Item 21 on page 113 of the Revised Protectorate Estimates.

These ladies were included amongst the vacancies, whose selection by the Union Government is notified in Sir E. Borthwick's telegram No. 593 of the 20th August and their salaries and passage expenses have been met from savings under the general vote of the Department.

I regret that through an oversight Your Lordship's authority for this additional personnel was not invoked at the time the engagements were reported.

I may add that provision for seven further Nursing Sisters is being inserted in the draft Estimates bringing the total staff under this head up to 20. The proposed

It will be observed that three of the new nurses will be employed at native hospitals.

5. Your Lordship is aware that improved hospital facilities are imperative both for the white and native population and I trust that despite financial restrictions Your Lordship will approve of the above complement in full, as it represents the minimum requirements of the Protectorate.

6. I shall be glad to receive telegraphic advice of Your Lordship's decision with regard to the additional staff for the coming year, as in the event of your approval the Principal Medical Officer proposes to engage the new nurses from South Africa.
