

With reference to Lord Milner's Confidential despatch of Loth November, 1920, I have the honour to transmit herewith a memorial addressed to yourself by Eneg Singh son of Thakur Singh, late of the Conservancy Department, Mombasa, appealing against a local decision that he was not eligible for a pension on retirement from the service.

- 2. The petitioner, who writes from Lahore, India, states that he has forward twice copies of this memorial direct to the Colonial Office.
- 3. The post held by the petitioner was not a pensionable one, and his emolements were less than sixty per a num, the minimum for a pensionable appointment.
