With reference to Lieutenant Colonel Notley's despatch No. 1341 of 26th September, I have the honour to inform you that I have authorized the imposition of a further collective fine upon the natives of the Lumbwa Buret, Sotik Reserve, under the Collective Punishments Ordinance.

2. The total fine in this instance is Shs: 3800/- and my recommendation is based upon judicial investigations conducted by the District Commissioner into four separate cases of cattle, in one case from a trader at the Lumbwa District and in the remaining cases from Kivirondo on the borders of the district, in one of which was at least one animal. The identity of the thief and the original owner of the stolen stock was tracked into the native reserve under circumstances indicating a very strong belief that the native authorities could have been able to apprehend the offender had they desired.

If the total fine of Shillings 2350/- will be paid as compensation to the owners of the stolen animals.

3. The imposition of the fine has been recommended by the District Commissioner, Lumbwa, the Senior Commissioner, Nyanza, and by the Chief Native Commissioner -
