1. This looks rather serious for East Africa next year (1920-21). The a/f. is imperfectly sighted and to say the least is in the new native tobacco in the circumstances - I suppose we must accept his statement that the proposed administrative measures cannot be made effective in 1920-21.
2. As to deposit of £250,000, our loss experience shows that possibly we might get a loan from the Treasury provided that East Africa is under their financial control.
