THE OSTRICH (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE, 1922.

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Ordinance repeals Section 6 of the Principal Ordinance of 1907 whereby it was possible only for a person of European birth or descent to be registered as an Ostrich Farmer. Though the racial distinction is removed the substituted section requires the applicant to be a land-holder. This provision guards against non-Europeans being granted licences in areas where they are not allowed to hold land.

The section is also amended so as to secure that only genuine Ostrich farmers can receive Ostrich hunters' licences. This end <sup>is</sup> achieved by the provision requiring the applicant to satisfy the District Commissioner of his intentions.
