THE PRISONS (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE, 1922.

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to allow Asiatic and African subordinate officers, who are in the Prison Department of this Colony within a certain number of months of having received a certificate of discharge from the Prison Department of the Uganda Protectorate or Tanganyika Territory, to count such previous service as if it had been served in the Prison Department of this Colony.

This measure has had the approval of the Secretary of State in his despatch No. 1457 dated the 24th September, 1921.
