My Lord Duke,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of Mr. Churchill's despatch No. 1364, of the 20th September, and to inform Your Grace that in accordance with the ruling contained in his despatch No. 817 of the 30th of May last, the gratuity payable to Jamadar Shiv Bux, recommended in Sir Edward Northey's despatch No. 1014 of the 22nd July requires re-calculation. The amount payable now amounts to Shs. 1273/85, of which, the Government of Uganda is liable for Shs. 255/88.

2. In this connection I would observe that the gratuity recommended has been based on the maximum of Jamadar Shiv Bux's grade equality salary and was found exceeded the maximum set down for his class of appointment.
