plots encroaced upon alternated farms, and Mr. Jeffrith was informed in January, 1910; that as practically all the land applied for was covered by prior applications, the areas in question could not be granted. He was accordingly asked to make other selections.

- 5. At an interview in May 1910 Mr. Griffiths contended that all except one of the plots were in the Native Reserve and did not clash with other grants.
- 6. It was not until 1910 that it was found possible to depute a surveyor to investigate further and it was then definitely established that three of the plots encroached on private land.
- 7. Negotiations were opened by the Land Office with the owner of one of the farms encroached upon, with a view to an exchange, which was eventually effected thus removing the obstacle to the grant of that particular area applied for by the Mission.
- B. Further action was misheded owing to the war, but the remaining furts where encrosedment occurred have since reverted to the Crown and the obstacles which for so long delayed satisfaction of the Mission claims are now removed.
- 9. Two of the plots and a portion of a third are in the Dumma Native area and the remaining portion of the third and the other ? are in the Nyika Native Reserve and were not excluded therefrom when the Reserve was gazetted in 1916.
- 10. The native authorities concerned have been consulted and have unanimously declared themselves in favour of the grant of the leases to the Mission subject, however, to a provise that there shall be no transfer of the land by the leasess and that it shall not be used

for any purpose other than the furtherance of genuine mission work. I am satisfied as to the genuineness of their assent.

- 11. The grant of the leases is supported by the Chief Native Commissioner. The District Commissioner reports that all the plots are occupied by the Mission apparently entirely for Mission purposes.
- 12. In view of the facts set out above it is clear that, but for the matter of encroachments, the Mission would long ago have been in possession of titles to the plots, all of which have been occupied for various periods and developed by cultivation and the building of chapels, schools, etc.
- of the Mission to the areas in question (about 520 acres in all) should be recognized by this Government, and I recommend that leases abould be granted for a term of 99 years, subject to the provisos set out in paragraph 10 and to a nominal rent, which should be paid into the Natives' Trust Fund for the benefit of the natives concerned, as indicated in paragraph 3 (6) of Mr. Churchill's despatch No. 1315 of the 25th August, 1921.
- 14. I do not consider that it is necessary to add an equivalent area to the Native Reserve.
