At an interview in May 1910 Vr . Griffitha contended that all excent one of tile plote were in the Native Reserve and did not clash with other grants.

10. The native artanritiae concerned have beon consulted and nave unanimously declared themeelves in favour of the prant of the leases to the kidssion subject, nowevar, to a proviso that there shall be no tranefer of the land by the lessees and that it ahall not be used
fur any purpose other than the furtherance of genuine mission wort. I am satisfied as to tho genutrentema of

12. In view of the facts set out above it is clear. that, but for the matter of encroachments, the Mission would i long ago have been in possession of titles to the plots, all of whion have been occupied for various periods and dfiveloned by cultivation and the building of onapele, schools, etc.
13. In tile circumstances I consider that the claim of the Mission to the areas in question (about 520 acres in all) should be recognized by this Government, and I recommend that 1 babas ahould be granted for a term of 99 years, subject to the pravtage aet out in paragraph In and to a nominal rent, which sioula be paid into the Natives' frost front for the benefit of the natives ooncerriel, as indicated in paragraph $a(6)$ of Nr. Chur chill's debpaten-No. 1315 of the 25 th August, 1921. 14. I do not consider that it is necessary to add an equivalent area to tine Native Reserve.
