Sir,

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Sir G. Grindle's letter of the 10th instant (5407/1922), and the enclosed paraphrase of a telegram from the Governor of Kenya.

In reply I would request you to inform

the Secretary of State that my Lord's honour in the view of the reasons given in the second paragraph of the telegram will be satisfied by the word "Instrument" in section 7(1) of the first African Restriction of Payments Order in the case of the intention to withdraw from the service of the Colony of Cyprus on or about the 1st April, 1923, amounting to £1000/- and dated on the 1st April, 1923, the day on which he proposes to leave the service (i.e. before the publication of his intended resignation) and to receive no pay after the 1st April, 1923.
