the Government of the Colony,

Further letter from the Commissioner of Lands
dated 15th June 1928 (Ref. No. 45/1117)
informing Mrs. Payne that as neither
she nor any of her family occupied the land
concerned during the first three years subsequent to
completion of the farm was liable to forfeiture.

In answer to this complaint Mrs. Payne pointed
out that her Medical advisers still prevented her from
leaving home taking the journey to British West Africa, also
stating that she had not hitherto seen more than the
conditions of allotment permitted the appointment of an
Ex-Service Manager as her representative, and that she
would at once attempt to find a suitable manager to
place in charge if the District authorities would agree to
this being done.

The Commissioner of Lands at Harare replied on
September 1st, 1928 granting a further extension of six
months before forfeiture of farm provided a Medical
Certificate of Health for Mr. Payne was supplied, but
she was to deposit reply as to the paper value of the
land before the 1st of December.

Mrs. Payne at once posted the Medical Certificate
and covering letter, and the specific provisions mentioned
were appointed an Ex-Service Manager and personal attendance
at the office before February 3rd 1929 (the date of
expiry of the last extension of time granted) would be
a week.

Copy of a Storage Certificate issued by
the General Department for Ex-Service Men
dated 1st August 1928, in which it is stated
that Mr. Payne has been appointed an Ex-Service

him.

Dear Sir,

As Women's Branch of the Overseas Settlements Committee the above Society has been consulted by Mrs. Bayne of Spring Park, Shillington, Surrey upon the following matter.

Mrs. Bayne, late Women Inspector under the Women's Branch of the Ministry of Agriculture, applied in September 1919 for grant of land in Kenya Colony under the Land Settlement scheme, and was allotted holding in the Lumbwa district in February 1921, which date her appointment at the Ministry of Agriculture terminated.

One of the conditions attaching to the grant was that the owner should enter into possession of the land of allotment. But finding that her husband would not permit him to travel to Kenya Mrs. Bayne wrote to the Land Department in February 1921 and asked for an extension of time for this application and the required extension was granted.
