RAILWAY MARINE.

I enclose your letter dated 15th June, 1920,

which herewith for your convenience,
 I have had the pleasure to forward to you,
 the General Manager of the Uganda

Railway. It will be seen from this letter that
 the Acting Allowance cannot be paid to
 a senior officer while that officer is on
 leave for a short period through illness.

It is the very definite nature of the statement

in your letter of the 15th June, 1920, in the

last sentence that naturally caused a considerable
 amount of anxiety among the Officers concerned. I beg to

trust, therefore, that the General Manager is not aware of the

nature of this ruling made by the Colonial Office and I
 trust, therefore, that the matter will have your prompt attention.

The statement in your letter is quite unqualified and the interpretation
 naturally places upon it by the Officers is that when, by
 reason of the absence of the Officer who holds the substantive
 appointment, a junior Officer holding that appointment for the
 time being, he shall be entitled to the Acting Allowance.

Trusting to have a satisfactory reply on the matter in
 the near future.
