Mr. William Littlejohn Philip was appointed Consulting Engineer
to proceed to South Africa with two expert assistants, to fully advise
the Government as to best system, design capacity &c. and to prepare
complete plans and specifications, the Government undertaking to furnish
necessary staff and local office accommodation and local information
free travelling facilities on the South African Railways, but it was
understood that calling for tenders, the adjudication thereof and the
execution of the execution of the various resulting contracts should
be undertaken by the permanent officials of the Government.

Fee £1000 per month payable date of sailing to date of
arrival in England.

In addition to fee an allowance of £200 per month for
living expenses only one assistant whose allowance would be
£100 accordingly.

All efforts to be made to complete the above work in
12 months.

All Reports, Plans, Maps, Specifications and Specifications
remain the property of Government.

Mr. William Littlejohn Philip's firm Messrs. ... & Co
are to be allowed to tender in public competition and in event
of becoming successful tenderers for machinery, materials or other
work thereof they would grant rebate of fees paid since
the amount of such contracts up to point when whole
